## PRE-AP OR NOT?

- If you are in Academic Math, you need to take Academic Math next year. You may not skip from Wath 7 academic into Alocbra Inext vear because you will have missed an entire rear of math. Please keep in mind that Academic Math 8 is Pre-Algebra. You may only skip from Math 7 Academic into Algebra l if you pass the CBE (Credit by Exam - Math 8 CBE) over the summer - not recommended.
- If you are in Academic Math this year, Pre-AP Science will be very difficult next year. They will be learning Physics concepts in the first nine weeks and you will not have the math skills needed.
- If you are making solid A's in your Academic LA and/or TX History classes, please consider moving to Pre-AP for next year!!

## Digital Photography 8TH GRADE ONLY <br> High School fine Arts Credit

In this year-long class, students complete a rigorous course of digital photography, including:

- Operating a digital SLR camera
- Elements of Art \& Photography
- Lighting and flash
- Event, action, and portrait shooting
- Programs such as Photoshop and InDesign

Students are required to submit entries for various competitions during the year.

It is recommended that students have their own Digital Camera with Aperture \& Shutter Speed settings

Digital Photography takes field trips to offer students opportunities to expand their photography portfolio (additional fees apply)

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Memorial Middle School has many technology electives.
Our courses are designed to give students an introduction to courses that prepare them for high school.
Some courses are even offered to our 8th grade students as high school credit.

Intro to Computer Science 7TH AND 8TH GRADE

In this semester-long class, using
Scratch, a visual programming language where they can create their own interactive games and animations with "drag-and-drop" programming.
Students will develop projects that:

- Incorporate design, animation, music \& storytelling
- Construct Apps to run on an Android devices

Students may take this course once only.

Fundamentals of Computer Science 8th Grade only

High School Technology CREDIT

In this year-long class, students study advanced computer science $\&$ coding languages

- Students will foster their creativity and innovation through opportunities to design, implement, and present solutions to real-world problems.
